## **SALT RIVER TUBING'S SAFETY PROTOCOLS**

**SALT RIVER TUBING cannot guarantee that you will not be exposed to the Corona virus during your visit.** The CDC advises that some people are more likely than others to become severely ill, and some people are at a higher risk of exposure to COVID-19. Guests should evaluate their own risk in determining whether to visit Salt River Tubing. People who show no symptoms can spread COVID-19 if they are infected, and any interaction with the general public poses an elevated risk of being exposed to COVID-19. By visiting Salt River Tubing, you acknowledge and agree that you assume these inherent risks associated with attendance.

### **SRTR COVID-19 PROTOCOL UPDATE**

#### **Face Masks are NOT required IF COVID-19 VACCINATED**

In accordance with new guidance from the CDC and local and state recommendations, SRTR Guests who have been **FULLY VACCINATED against COVID-19** will no longer be required to wear a Face Mask at the SRTR Tube Terminal, Shuttle Buses or Shuttle Bus Loading Zones on the river. Consistent with CDC guidance, SRTR will continue to **Recommend Face Masks for UNVACCINATED Guests**. Additionally, safe distancing will no longer be required.

- SRTR Employees that have been fully COVID-19 vaccinated have the CHOICE to wear/or not to wear a Face Mask. Daily temperature checks will be administered to all employees. SRTR *Unvaccinated* Employees will be required to wear a Face Mask.
- Shuttle buses will be disinfected nightly (every 24-hours) with disinfectant solutions.
- SRTR Safety Protocol signage is posted at the SRTR Terminal Building (Tube Rental Facility) and Bus Stops #1, #2, and #4.
